

Low Impact packed lunches at Thornham Field Centre

REMEMBER THE BEST WAY TO REDUCE RUBBISH IS TO STOP MAKING IT!



How to prepare a low impact packed lunch:

- Carry the lunch in a container which can be used again or disposed of in a compost bin (paper bag)
- Wrap sandwiches, rolls etc in greaseproof paper or use a reusable container
- Drinks should be in a reusable container
- Avoid anything with a lot of packaging
- Fruit is good—needs no extra

RUBBISH DISPOSAL AT THORNHAM

When you come to Thornham you will be given two biodegradable rubbish bags on day one, (one for compost the second for other rubbish) Please separate your rubbish after lunch into the appropriate bin. We will put the compost in our own compost bin and weigh the rubbish from the landfill bin. We will send you a bar chart comparing the amount of rubbish you have left to that left by the last 10 schools who have visited Thornham. The only recycling facilities we have on site are for cans, there are good recycling facilities at the Thornham Village Hall.



EXTRA IDEAS

Depending on the age of your pupils you might like to use the discussion about lunch preparation as an opportunity to talk about:

Food miles—discuss how far different foods have travelled? Is this a good idea?

Can individuals make a difference by doing things like recycling?
